The Homework Menu

Following the introduction of the Homework Menu, we have found that the tasks which have the highest impact on children's learning are reading, spellings, number bonds and times tables (Year 2). As a school, we have therefore taken the decision to make these our **compulsory tasks** whilst making all other tasks **optional**. Your child may want to explore their own activity which has been inspired by the work they have done in school. This would be great and we would love them to bring their research into school.

Side Orders (Optional)

These activities, which link with the topics being studied in class, can be completed to further extend your child's learning.

Sort your toys into the materials that they are made from e.g plastic, wood, metal and fabric. Are some toys made from more than one material?



Ask your family and carers about the toys they played with when they were children? Which toys were their favourite and why?



Go on a winter walk look for signs of winter. Can you find deciduous and evergreen trees?



Design your own toy of your dreams. Draw a picture of it and label. You could write about the things it can do, or instructions on how to play with it.

Main Courses (Compulsory)

A range of these activities must be completed **every day** to support your child's learning.

Reading

- Read the school reading book and talk about the story. What are the main characters like? How are they feeling? What might happen next?
- Share a story with your child.
- Practise sounding out and blending words using phonics.

Spellings

- **Practise the weekly spelling words and high frequency words** (Spelling Passports). You could play a spelling game (chalking on your patio, writing in multi colours or make them out of playdough).
- Practise using the words in sentences.

Mathletics

The school provides your child with access to Mathletics. Log on and find an exciting activity to practise! Work is sometimes set, but you have access to all the activities and to score lots of points regularly visit Live Mathletics which helps build fluency.
