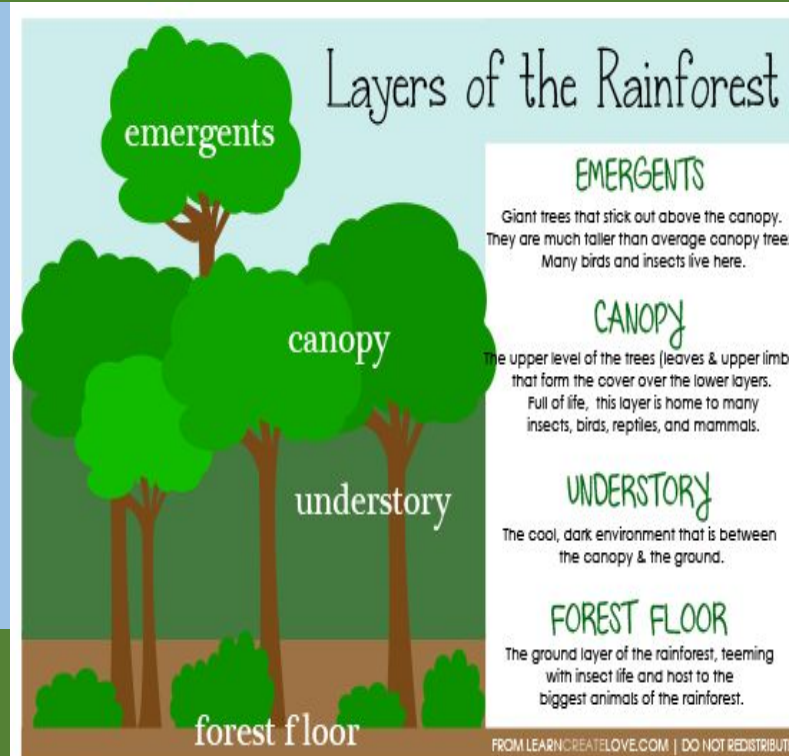


Year Six Term 4 Geography - Exploring the New World

Key Vocabulary:

- biome:** a large geographical area which is home to certain plants and animals specially adapted to suit the environment;
- climate:** general weather conditions in an area or country;
- climate zone:** a part of the world with a particular climate;
- contour lines:** lines on a map that show how high land is – the closer together, the steeper the land;
- deforestation:** the action of clearing a large area of trees;
- fair trade:**
- flora/fauna:** plant and animal life;
- fold mountains:**
- hemisphere:** one half of the Earth – top/bottom = Northern/Southern
- tectonic plates:** the theory that the Earth's outer shell is divided into large slabs of solid rock called "plates"
- terrain:** the features of the surface of a piece of land;
