School Structure

An aspect of determining our school structure is always dependent on the number of children on roll in the October census. We are aware that there continues to be a fall in EYFS school admissions across Kent.

We aim to have two classes in each year group but numbers dictate whether this is always possible.

We currently have one mixed class and will do until the school roll increases. Mixed classes and single aged classes have both worked effectively for children to learn well at Tenterden Infant School.

Our class names are named after our favourite endangered animal. Maximum class size is 30.

The School Day

Our school day runs 8:45am start to 3:15pm.

8:35am: School gates open

We ask that you take your child to the EYFS wooden gate which is located in the Infant School playground.

8:45am: School gates close

All children should be in the classroom by 8.45am to start their school day. If, for any reason you arrive after the school gates have closed, please bring your child to the school office where they will be taken to their classroom.

3:05pm: School gates open

The school gates open on an automatic timer at 3:05pm ready for you to wait in the Infant School playground to collect your child.

3:15pm: Pick up

All children are dismissed by their school teacher at 3:15pm. Staff dismiss children from their class in line with our safeguarding policy. Adults collecting must be named and 18+ years of age.

Wrap Around Care

Early Birds: 8:00am – 8:45am

We have morning club called Early Birds for working parents and each session is currently £2.50. It runs from 8:00am to the time school starts.

After School Club: 3:15pm – 5:00pm

We have an after school club for parents and each session is currently £10.00. It runs from the end of the school day until 5:00pm. The children enjoy a variety of engaging activities and enjoy sharing ideas.

Both clubs are very popular and we take termly payment to secure a place.

Transition

Transition has focused on allowing time for you to become familiar with the classroom environment and staff supporting your child. Transition shares the class routines and lunch procedures.

School Uniform

- *School zipper fleece* (for outdoor wear only)
- *School Sweatshirt* (for indoor and outdoor wear)
- *Light Blue Polo Shirt*
- *School Book Bag*
- *Summer dress blue check*
- *Trousers - Grey**
- *Skirts - Grey*
- *Socks and tights - White, Grey or Navy (plain)***
- *Shoes - Black* (no boots, trainers or open toe shoes)
- *Hair accessories* - to be kept to a minimum, no large bows or clips.
- *Earrings* - All earrings are to be studs only

** Children are permitted to wear plain knee high socks, socks must not go over the knee.

Working with our classmates in partner or group work. We think about what others are thinking. We are connected learners.



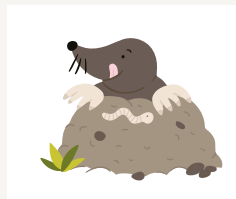
Super Squirrel

-  What do you need to do to make things better?

We work together to keep your child's safe. All incidents/disclosures are recorded on our digital platform CPOMS (Child Protection Online Monitoring System).

Communication and Celebration

Recognising and celebrating all children's efforts

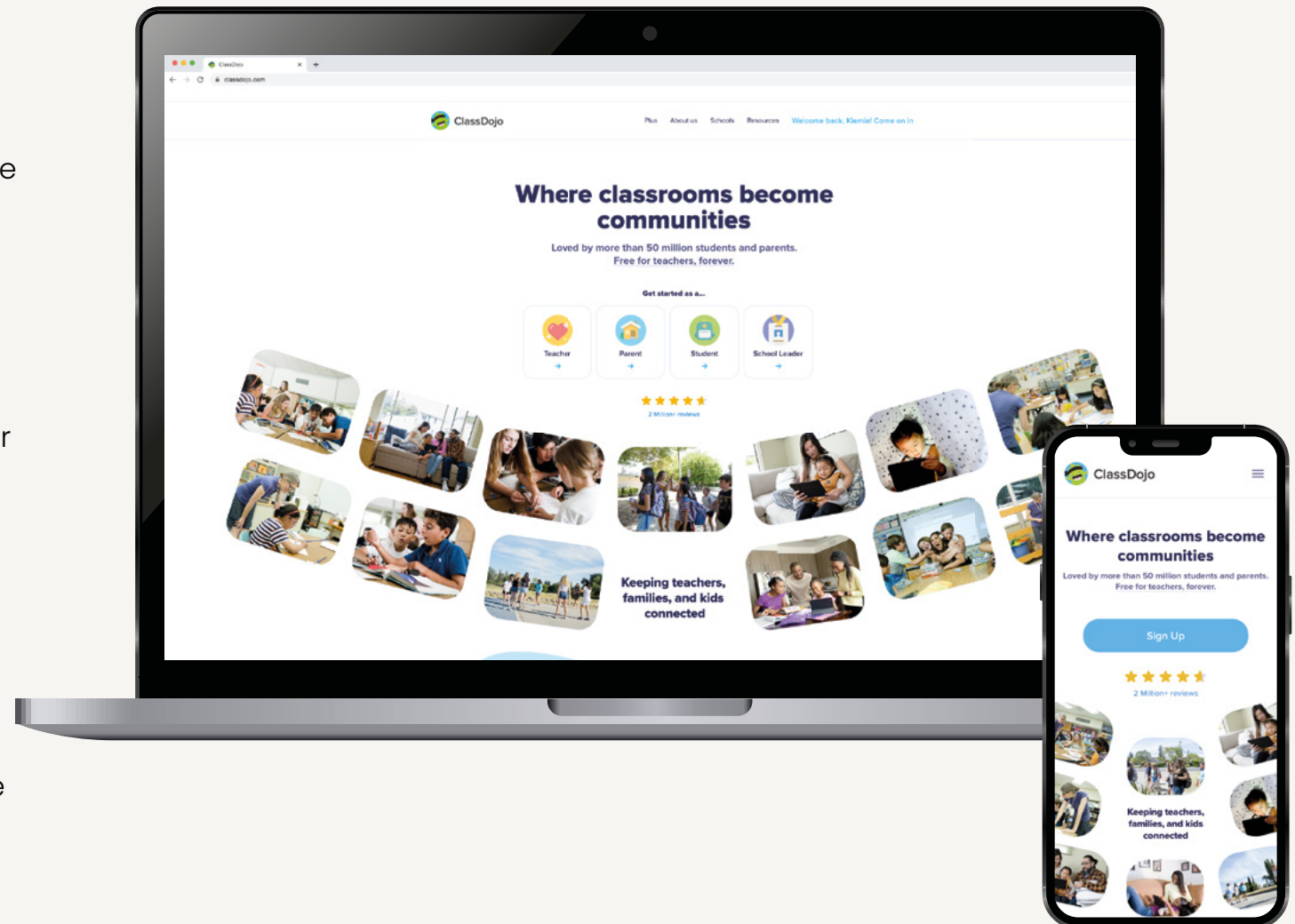
We use Class Dojo to communicate with all parents/carers.

Each child has their own icon and staff give reward Dojo points for achievements and effort linked to BLP and the Golden Rules.

Dojo certificates are given out after achieving multiples of 50 points. Multiples of 100 are celebrated in assemblies along with Head Teacher Awards.

The class team share celebrations and upcoming events/activities with you via the class story.

Curriculum continuity from Tenterden Infant School to Tenterden Junior School

Tenterden Infant School is Federated with Tenterden Church of England Junior School.

We work closely to develop the children's learning journey through the Primary Phase; planning our curriculums together to ensure consistency of presentation, teaching and learning pedagogies and building on prior learning.

We are a strong staff who love teaching and learning. There are times when the children work and play across year groups and these are always a lot of fun too.

We follow the White Rose curriculum in Maths which ensures high expectations and opportunities for applying maths facts.

Phonics and English

We continue from the phonics learnt in preschools and we follow the validated scheme Little Wandle.

We have lots of opportunities for enjoying listening to stories and facts. Children read and share books.

In English we also enjoy the creativity of using 'Talk for Writing' skills to promote reading, writing and language acquisition. The children love learning to retell and adapt stories using pictorial representations.

In this way we promote a love of reading and high expectations when developing out writing skills. Children love to share their stories and written accounts as they develop their writing skills and use of exciting vocabulary.

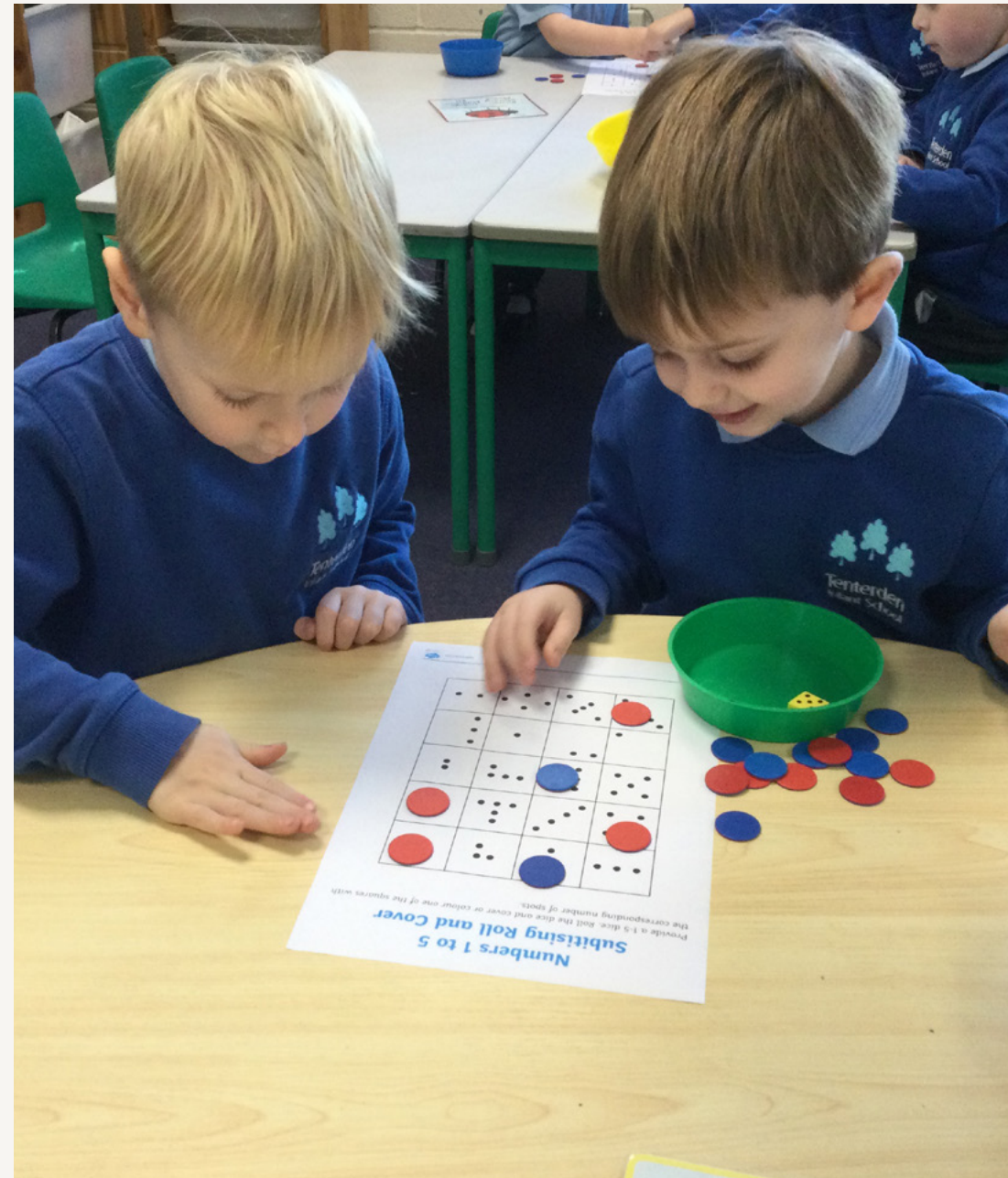


Core strength and balance

Maths

We adopt a small step mastery exploration of maths, focusing on small step learning to ensure understanding and confident number recognition.

We focus on using lots of pictorial representations and practical tasks to question, understand and explore number and shape. Children learn to mark make to represent numbers and then progress to learning digits and math symbols.



Fine and Gross Motor Skills

Through a variety of engaging activities we develop fine motor skills, strength and coordination. This includes building core strength on the outside apparatus, cycle and construction.

We love being active in the hall and outside. We have key balances and skills to learn . We use our hall for drama and dance activities too. This is also where we enjoy our whole school assemblies and lunch.

We regularly use our bikes and trikes, creating exciting routes.



Into the Woods

The outdoors has so much to offer our children and provides different opportunities to work collaboratively with others, take risks and explore nature. This builds curiosity, resilience and friendships, all of which have a significant impact on our learning.



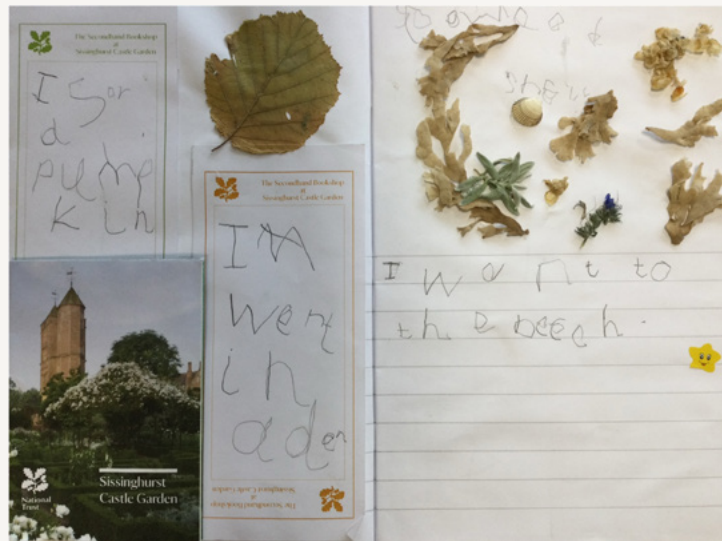
Into the Woods

EYFS spend one afternoon a week in our beautiful woodland area all year round, come rain or shine. Each week there is a different activity and the setting is enhanced with different resources.

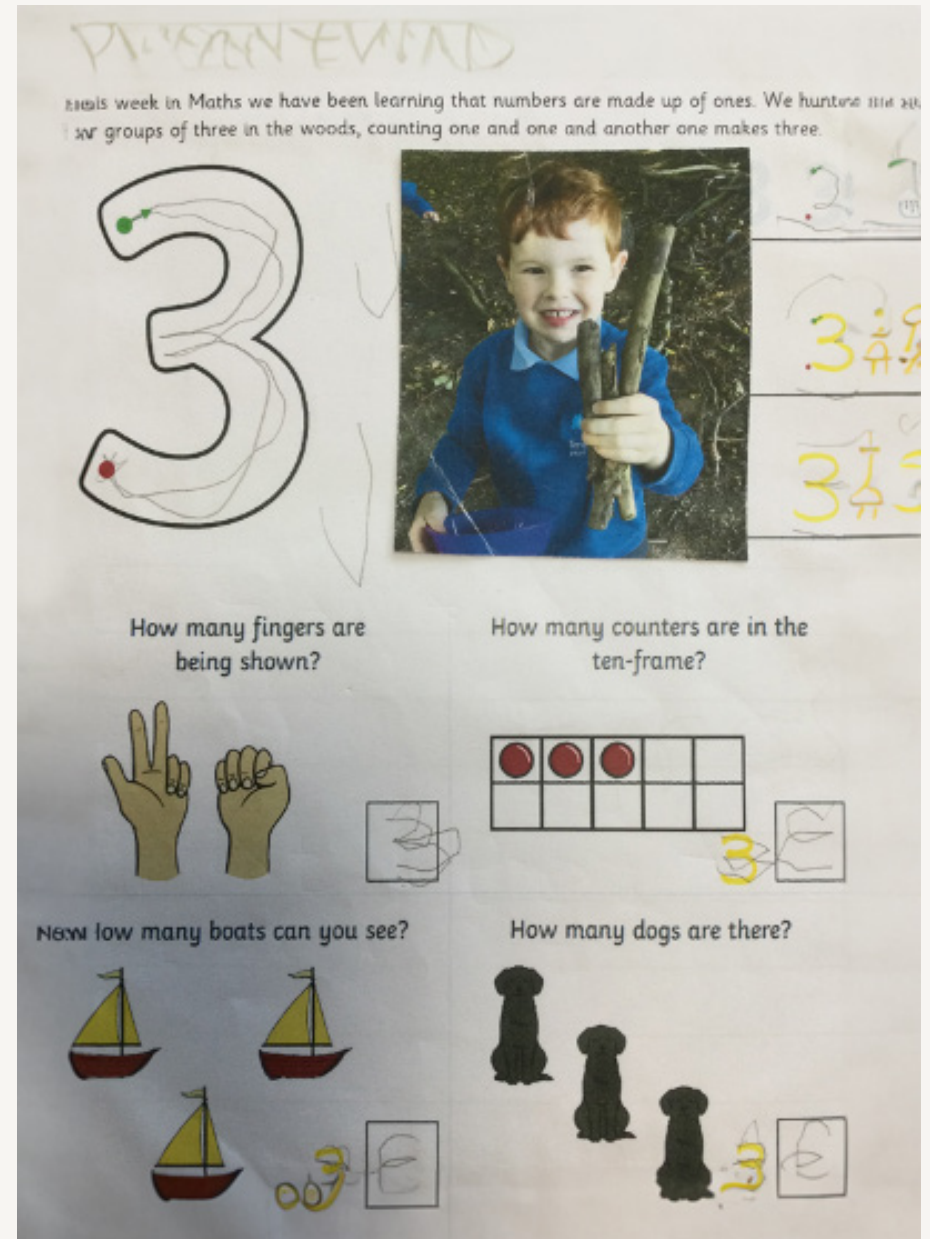


Working in Collaboration with Parents
