
The Homework Menu

Following the introduction of the Homework Menu we have found that the tasks which have the highest impact on children's learning are reading, spellings, number bonds and times tables (Year 2) As a school, we have therefore taken the decision to make these our **compulsory tasks** whilst making all other tasks **optional**. Your child may want to explore their own activity which has been inspired by the work they have done in school. This would be great and we would love them to bring their research into school.

Side Orders (Optional)

These activities, which link with the topics being studied in class, can be completed to further extend your child's learning.

- Find out about one of the Wonders of the World. Can you create a poster using key facts?



- Research a capital city in the UK. Can you find out about any landmarks?

- Create a weather diary for a week. Record the weather each day and see if you can spot any patterns.



- Listen to your favourite song. Can you clap along to the beat? Can you use a household item as an instrument to play along?



Main Courses (Compulsory)

Please complete some of these activities everyday.

Reading

- Read the school reading book and talk about the story. What are the main characters like? How are they feeling? What might happen next?
- Share a story with your child.
- Talk about what is happening to the characters and why.

Spellings

- Practise your spelling words and high frequency words (Exception Words sheet). You could play a spelling game (rearrange the letters, describe the word, guess the word)
- Practise using the words in sentences.
- Use Spelling Frame to help you to learn your spellings, these are updated weekly.

Mathletics

The school provides your child with access to Mathletics. Log on and find an exciting activity to practise! Work is sometimes set, but you have access to all the activities and to score lots of points regularly visit Live Mathletics which helps build fluency.
