Islam 	The name of a religion followed by Muslim people.
Muslim 	A Muslim is a person who follows Islam.
Allah 	Allah is the name Muslims use for God.
Prophet Muhammad	Prophet Muhammad is a special messenger of Allah. Muslim people do not draw the Prophet Muhammad because they believe it is important to show him respect.
Ummah 	Worldwide, diverse community of Muslim people.
Mosque 	A mosque is a place where Muslims go to pray, learn and be together.
Qur'an 	The Qur'an is the holy book of Islam.
Ramadan 	Ramadan is a special month when many Muslims fast in the daytime.
Fast 	To fast means not eating or drinking for a period of time.
Eid-ul-Fitr 	Eid-ul-Fitr is a happy celebration at the end of Ramadan. It is a time for family, food, gifts and prayer.

Islam is a diverse and global faith. Followers of Islam are called Muslims. There are many Muslim people living all around us and in the UK.
Muslims believe in God (Allah) and follow the example of the Prophet Muhammad. There are many stories about the Prophet Muhammad.
The Holy Qur'an is a special book for Muslim people. It says how Muslim people should live.
Muslim people pray and worship Allah in different ways, such as praying every day and going to the mosque.
Muslims celebrate special times like Ramadan and Eid-ul-Fitr.
