Our Snowdog's Story 2018


How Tis became our treasured school Snowdog.








Each class had a suggestion box and filled it with exciting names.

Being a Wise Owl makes sure we make wise choices and learn new facts each day.






We are all Action Ants helping each other in our work and play every day.
